Hôpitaux de Lyon

As a Public Centre of Excellence, the «Hospices Civils de Lyon» make up the second-largest University Hospital Network in France

For over 200 years, as a network providing expertise in all disciplines – both medical and surgical – the Hospices Civils de Lyon have offered a wide range of human, technical and logistical resources to ensure that they provide care, training, research, medical innovation as well as disease prevention and health education. Today, the HCL comprise 14 multidisciplinary or specialised establishments providing a diverse range of services.

The HCL also make up a world-class network for the fight against cancer, and are ranked amongst the 25 best hospitals in the world.

They are key establishments particularly in neurosciences, genetics and rare diseases.

With an annual budget allocation of 1.5 billion Euros, more than 5,400 beds and spaces and over 23,000 professionals, of which 5,000 are internationally recognised doctors with access to the latest equipment, the network devotes itself daily to its mission: contributing towards the constant improvement of the health of the French and Europeans.



A full, revised care offer

14 hospital establishments, organised into 6 groups, offer services covering all types of pathology:

- multidisciplinary establishments
- specialised establishments
- geriatric hospitals

To ensure higher levels of accommodation comfort, more than half of our beds have been upgraded since 2007.



Research and innovation

Research and innovation are strategic cornerstones for the CHLs. The UHN (French "CHU") is the main location from which clinical research is carried out, in partnership with the university, scientific and technical public establishments as well as the pharmaceutical and biomedical private sector:

- 300 clinical trials conducted each year (including 16,000 patients in 2010).
- 1,500 studies carried out at the CHLs in 2010
- 1,700 scientific publications in 2010.

The HCL are associated with :

- 2 research centres (cancer research and neurosciences)
- 1 centre for clinical investigation
- 22 INSERM (French National Institute of Health and Medical Research) units
- 22 CNRS (French National Centre for Scientific Research) research units
- 1 INRA (French National Institute of Agronomical Research) unit
- 1 regional centre for research into human nutrition

5 key fields:

- Cancer research/onco-haematology
- Infectious diseases, immunology, inflammation
- Nutrition, cardiovascular
- Neurology
- Transplantation

The HCL in figures

- 23,000 professionals, of which more than 5,000 are doctors
- An annual gross revenue of almost 1,500 million Euros
- Over 5,400 beds and day hospitalisation places
- 41 operating blocks
- 123 operating theatres
- 26 delivery rooms
- 30 laboratories

Annual activity

- Over 1.4 million hospitalisation days (including long stays)
- Over 145,000 day hospitalisations

Our hospitals cater for patients across the entire Rhône-Alpes region and beyond.



Training, a pledge towards the quality of care

Almost 1,600 health professionals are trained at the 11 schools and institutes making up the HCL : nurses, specialised nurses, radiology operators, nurses' aides, ambulance drivers, midwives, health executives.

The UHN collaborates with 4 Faculties of Medicine, 1 Faculty of Odontology, 1 Faculty of Pharmacy and 1 Technical Institute for Rehabilitation ; it is also involved each year in the training of :

- over 1,700 students
- over 600 interns



Equipment

In particular, the HCL are equipped with :

- 8 scintillation cameras
- 4 particle accelerators
- 1 tomograph for positron emission (+3 tomographs in partnership with the Regional Centre for the Fight against Cancer)
- 1 centre for robotic surgery



Lyon, formerly Lugdunum in 43 BC - within sight of Condate, a small Gallic markettown, which became Luon in the Middle Ages, then Lion and thereafter Lyon.

NATIONALITY

French through its art of living, taste for luxury and good food. Epitomised by a French woman who has always fired the imagination of her Italian neighbour, since the Romans who made it the capital of the Gauls, to the great merchants and bankers of the Renaissance who have left their mark in Old Lyon.

DISTINCTION

Listed as a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

CHARACTER

definitive, epicurean, generous, creative, open and lively.

COLOURS

ochre, sienna, pink in the old quarters running alongside the Saône, and bluish grey for the elegant façades running parallel to the banks of the Rhône. Green, crimson and gold-coloured for Beaujolais.
